The information on the departmental website is in both Chinese and English. Where appropriate and practicable, some information (e.g. guidance notes, forms, notices of individual rights, etc.) is translated into other languages for reference.• Where appropriate and practicable, the Department will arrange interpretation service.• In exercising immigration control, immigration staff will ensure effective communication with the people of diverse race. When passengers are refused permission to land, the notices served are available in different languages, so as to ensure that people of diverse race refused to land are able to understand the immigration policies relating to them. |

- The Department arranges training for its staff in relation to issues associated with equal opportunity and the Race Discrimination Ordinance.
 - The Department engages children and youth of diverse race through different channels, including talks, visits and training programmes etc.

- The Department will review our services from time to time, taking into consideration feedback and suggestions from the public and staff so as to further enhance our services when necessary and appropriate. To have a better understanding of the needs of the service users of different races, the Department will also collect information on the “need for interpretation / translation services” and “preferred languages” (other than Chinese and English) with a view to monitoring service users’ equal access to public services and enabling continuous improvement of service provision.
